

Re: Greg Neise's possible Slaty-backed Gull

Oh gosh; I was afraid of this.

There were a couple of additional off-hand comments on the Facebook thread that I deleted. One where I said "Definitely NOT!!!" to the request to quote me and another where I said "It is definitely not a Western Gull." In retrospect I should have left those comments up.

Anyway, separation from Western Gull is easier than I thought. However as Al Jaramillo pointed out, the tricky birds have always been the hybrids Herring x Glaucous-winged, and Western x Glaucous-winged.

Those issues still apply to any claimed Slaty-backed in North America. Greg's bird does indeed look good for Slaty-backed in my view, but the soft focus, worn plumage and extensive variation in both Slaty-backed and various hybrid combinations (including Slaty-backed X Glaucous-winged) conspire to make its identification less than iron clad. Under the circumstances I believe the Illinois decision was correct. That is not to say the bird was not a Slaty-backed; just that the evidence is not conclusive based on current knowledge.
