Gave impression of larger warbler. Dark gray/black back extending onto the head with darkening of loral feathers. Broken eye ring. Yellow breast, feathers decreasing in color saturation near the belly and bright white undertail coverts. Broken black streaks along flanks.

**Description of behavior:** 

Bird flitted its tail repeatedly, similar to Palm Warbler. Bird flew back and forth between open mud planters, flower trees, and taller more mature trees. Bird is still present at the time this report is being submitted.

**Description of vocalizations:** 

Gurgling, bouncy sing-song pattern. Like a wacked out Kentucky warbler. Recording obtained by Nathan Goldberg.

Description of immediate and surrounding habitat(s):

Urban park. Large mature trees that have been pruned up to 20-30 feet with a few lower trees commingled. Paved areas prevalent, open mud planters and flowering trees nearby.
