The committee position was to not vote on a reconsideration at the time as the data presented was felt to be not new or strong enough to stimulate a motion to revote from committee members other than me so I did not motion so. There was overwhelming support to pursue the stable isotope analysis, however and thus, develop more critical, "new" information that would be votable. John

Amy: Here is the corrected copy -I hope that you will read this. The year of the record is still incorrect. Thank you for your comments and feedback (any and all feedback is good) regarding the individual interviewed who observed the bird. I was pointing out the weakness in this testimonial in lieu of lack if any other provenance. Had nothing to do with the word " hunter" or hunters.

I believe this is a botched first state record, based upon the information we have now. We'll see if isotope analysis of feathers can prove anything or be affordable for that matter. I would think we would at a minimum, need to also run a captive 40th parallel BRGO sample to qualify the experiment with a "control" sample. We probably want to submit other states' samples and publish in a national journal, while were at it.

If you read on, the attached info reveals that no other state has accepted this species without a proven record within 1000 miles and this an established pattern of vagrancy. At that point, they accept wary, winter birds associating with W Greenland geese and use unclipped halluxes as supporting data.

I have updated and added new info as far as Indiana originally presented it for a vote is concerned. I was surprised to hear that even IL. With now more than a dozen records won't touch this. We are the only Midwest state to accept. You have to go to Ontario(Scotland banded bird) or eastern PA to find the next accepted record.
