3. Location St. Louis - Mississippi River

6. Description of size, shape and color-pattern (describe in great detail all parts of the plumage, and beak and feet coloration, in addition, to the diagnostic characteristics, but include only what actually was seen in the field):
Size - Close to Herring Gull size - Mantle - Very dark - Legs - very pink - Much Brighter than Herring - Bill - Larger in proportion to head size - Color Yellow - bright red spot - Light streaking on white head - eye yellow head seemed flatter in comparison to Herring - different shape This Bird appeared bulkier - white band of primaries evident when observed in flight and when wing was stretched out during preening
7. Description of voice, if heard: - Not heard
8. Description of behavior: Mixed in with several hundred Herring - 2 glaucous - 2 Thayers - seemingly no competition
9. Habitat - general: Mississippi River
specific: Ice Bar in shallow area of River

No other gull had mantle or markings of this bird
