Note buffy face without streaking, blue-hued speculum, and body feathering not as dark as for American Black Duck (and with broad buff edges on the covert and body feathers), all of which separate these birds from American Black Duck. Also note absence of white in the tail, no anterior white speculum border, yellow bill, and black spot at base of bill, ruling out Mexican Duck and Mallard. The broad white posterior speculum border on the left wing of one individual, and slightly broad white posterior speculum border on the right wing of the other, seem somewhat unusual.
