Large gull, similar in size to nearby Herring gulls, see photo #4. Stocky appearance, see photo #1 and 5. Mantle was dark gray (Kodak Gray scale for Slaty-backed Gull 9.5 – 11.5), similar to a Lesser Black-backed Gull (Kodak Gray scale 9.5 – 11.5), see photo #5. Dark smudge around eye, see photo #2. White head and nape, both were heavily streaked, some streaking on chest, see photo #1. Stout light colored bill with dark distal mark, see photo #6. White scapular and tertial crescent, see photo # 3.

Legs were pink.

Coldest temperatures for the month were recorded on Feb 13 with a low of 12 degrees. Temperatures on Feb 16 ranged from a high of 40 to a low of 30 degrees.

**11. Previous experience with this species and similar species:** One seen at Carlyle Lake on Dec 17, 2007 found by Dan Kassebaum.

### 12. Please eliminate other similar species and/or hybrids (use additional paper, if necessary):

Lesser Black-backed Gull is smaller than a Slaty-backed Gull and has (typically) yellow legs.

Great Black-backed Gull is larger and has a darker mantle (Kodak Gray scale 13 - 15) with very little streaking on head and nape.

Western Gull has larger bill and has less streaking on the head and nape. This gull is common along the U.S. Pacific coast, but regularly found well out at sea. The Western Gull is not typically found far inland.
