It had a round head and a straight bill. The flanks and breast were mottled brownish gray, the head and nape were more uniformly gray. When the bird extended his wings the outer primaries were nearly all black. There was a dark terminal band on the tail. The bill was very pale yellow with a black band. The bird appeared to have a frowning gape. The feet and legs were pale grayish-blue.
14) Description of behavior:	The bird rested alongside Ring-billed Gulls and Herring Gulls.
15) Description of vocalizations:	none
16) Description of immediate and surrounding habitat(s):	The bird was on ice and surrounded by wooden boat docks not far from the open water of Lake Michigan.

23) Please eliminate other similar species and/or hybrids:	The size is between a Ring-billed Gull and a Herring Gull which it was seen with. Thayer's Gull and Iceland Gull would not have dark primaries and would have pink legs. Lesser Black-backed Gull 2nd winter would have a darker mantle and show less yellow on the bill and have yellow legs.
