16) Description of immediate and surrounding habitat(s):	Large body of inland water, surrounded by trees, shrubs and brush, with many of the shrubs offering fruit.

22) Previous experience with this species and similar species:	Seen over 20 times in 2018 in Panama and in Peru.
23) Please eliminate other similar species and/or hybrids:	I did not attempt to eliminate other similar species or hybrids, primarily because the features of this bird are so unique for IL, and as its id had already been well established and scores of birders were on site viewing the same bird. A Lesser Kiskadee, which is most like this bird, would be even more improbable in Northern IL, and it size much smaller than the Robin-like size of the IL bird.
